





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Jewels from Jude

"Woe to Them!"

God has always been a God of Judgment. Ever since the first rebellion of man as recorded in Genesis chapter three, the Almighty has been making it clear that His wrath will be wreaked on a disobedient and unthankful world. The apostle Paul thus wrote that "the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men" (Romans 1:18). The writer Jude is insistent that Hat Judgment is not only coming upon the world of the ungodly, but even upon saints who fall into the trap of turning liberty in Christ to licentiousness in order to justify a carnal mindset. "Now I desire to remind you," he had earlier stated, before listing the judgments of God upon the rebellious who came out of Egypt, the fallen angels, and Sodom and Gomorrah. Serious business, indeed! These "revilers,"

then, end up being consumed by the evil they had fallen into. "The things which they know by instinct," commented Jude, "by these things they are destroyed." Not thinking things through, but following along a lustful path, they end up wrecking their lives and the lives of those around them.

- The way of Cain "Woe to them!" cries the author. "For they have gone the way of Cain" (Jude 1:11). Cain's "countenance fell," wrote Moses, when he became angry over God's not accepting his offering from the ground. At that point Cain had a choice over his future. "If you do well, will not your countenance be lifted up?" the All Knowing had asked. "And if you do not do well, sin is crouching at the door," He also warned, "and its desire is for you, but you must master it" (Genesis 4:7). Cain did not master it, rose up and killed his righteous brother Abel, and ended up "a vagrant and a wanderer on the earth" among his relatives (Genesis 4:12). These errant brethren, then, of whom Jude speaks, did not master the sin/righteousness choice set before them, followed the flesh, and became revilers on the surface of the earth.
- The error of Balaam The pronouncement of woe continues. "For pay they have rushed
 - headlong into the error of Balaam." Balak, the king of Moab, along with the elders of Midian, hired Balaam the diviner to come from the East to curse Israel as they made their way toward the Promised Land. With the "diviner's fee" itching in his palm, he thrice was prevented from cursing Israel and blessed him instead. Desiring to earn his pay, Balaam counseled the Midianites to intermingle with Israel, and thus Israel was being pulled into idolatry. "Balaam," wrote the apostle John in his specific message to the church

- at Pergamum, "kept teaching Balak to put a stumbling block before the sons of Israel, to eat things sacrificed to idols, and to commit acts of immorality" (Revelation 2:14). In his lust for the "diviner's fee," Balaam is described as having a donkey speak to him in order to have "the madness of the [false] prophet" restrained (2 Peter 2:16). Those who fall into "the error of Balaam" have a similar "mad" desire to compromise truth for the sake of twisted teaching which permits all sorts of perversions.
- The rebellion of Korah Korah was a leader among the Levites, who assisted the priests in their ministrations and who were in charge of transporting the tabernacle. As they in their evil ambition reached for the priesthood, God had them burn incense at the doorway of the tent of meeting in the presence of the whole congregation. Fire consumed the two hundred and fifty who were engaged in illegally burning incense before the Lord, and the earth opened and swallowed up the tents and families of those who joined Korah in his rebellion. Likewise, destruction will come upon the revilers who similarly counseled rebellion in turning the grace of God into licentiousness. They have, pointed out Jude, "perished in the rebellion of Korah."

The terms of the new covenant are not to be trifled with. "What then?" the apostle Paul had asked. "Shall we sin because we are not under law but under grace?" The revilers of whom Jude spoke had an answer: "Yes!" The apostle Paul had the inspired answer: "May it never be!" (Romans 6:15). Those who answer "Yes," go the way of Cain, rush headlong into the error of Balaam, and perish in the rebellion of Korah.
