

Jewels from Jude

"Hidden Reefs" in the "Love Feasts"

The apostle Peter describes the devil as a prowling, "roaring lion, seeking someone to devour" (1 Peter 5:8). What better place to find prey than in the assembly of the saints! And what better tools to use than those who are accepted as being in the body of Christ, and seem on the surface to be brethren in good standing. Jude has opened this epistle speaking of "certain persons who have crept in unnoticed," and described them as "ungodly persons who turn the grace of God into licentiousness" (Jude 1:4). Tools of the roaring lion! "These men" is a term that Jude uses often in pointing them out to the faithful saints. "These" men indulged in gross immorality as did Sodom and Gomorrah. "These men" revile angelic majesties. "These

men" revile things which they do not understand.

- Hidden reefs Jude continues: "These men," he says, "are those who are hidden reefs in your love feasts when they feast with you without fear, caring for themselves" (Jude 1:12). The "love feast," a term used by Jude, refers to a meal taken in connection with the weekly assembly of the saints. The apostle Paul had to tell the congregation in Corinth to back away from the meal in connection with the Lord's Supper because they were not mature enough in Christ for the "love feast" to be positive and edifying. "In your eating," he commented, "each one takes his own supper first [the thrust being that there was a scramble to be first in line]; and one is hungry and another is drunk" (1 Corinthians 11:21). Jude talks about the destructive men working their counterproductive agendas, using the love feast as the time for finding prospects open to their subtle but fleshly appeals. "Hidden reefs," Jude termed them, referring to the dangerous coral reefs often just below the surface of the sea and which can quickly rip open the bottom of a wooden vessel. And, says Jude, "they feast with you without fear." These "shepherds," as some translations bring forth, are so far down the licentious trail that they have no fear of God left in their darkened hearts. Deceptive, devious, dangerous men!
- Descriptive litany These men, observed the author, are those who are only "caring for themselves." Self-willed, they justify their behaviors by turning the grace of God into licentiousness, and then work to pull others into their self-justification scheme. The writer brings forth a series of graphic descriptions of these men, showing how fruitless and empty are the actual positive productions of their efforts. "Clouds without water," is the first on the list, using the picture of uselessness of a darkened sky passing over a parched

land, "carried along by winds." Another is this representation: "autumn trees without fruit, doubly dead, uprooted." Followed by this one: "wild waves of the sea, casting up their own shame like foam" (Jude 1:13). Where the ocean meets the shore, what is most visible and notable is the crashing of the waves and the resultant foam. These men's shameful deeds, from "wild" behavior, is visibly flaunted as the foam spraying up and splashing the rocky coast. The final illustration: "wandering stars, for whom the black darkness has been reserved forever." "These men" are going nowhere, plunging into the pit of eternal destruction, and taking as many with them as they can.

These graphic pictures painted by Jude are necessary to expose how evil these men are. They "crept in unnoticed," spreading their evil influence, their destructive conversations masked by suave smiles. It is often difficult for the brethren to believe that such urbane individuals can be evil; hence the somewhat brutal appellations are given by Jude and by the Holy Spirit. Make no mistake about it; these same types of individuals are constantly working modern congregations, pushing the same lawless agenda. Brethren must recognize who they are, resist their appeals, and expose their shameful behaviors and false doctrines.

The devil is still the roaring lion seeking someone to devour. And he has men (and women) like these as his willing tools.
